### **Regional Mock Trial Competitions Begin Saturday**

The Arkansas Bar Association's Mock Trial Regional Competitions will be held on Saturday, March 2 in Fayetteville, Jonesboro and Pine Bluff. The first round begins at 9:00 a.m. and the second round begins at 1:00 p.m. Each round should last around two hours.

More than 300 students from 25 high schools around the state will compete for the title of Mock Trial State Champions and the chance to compete at the national Mock Trial competition in Athens, Georgia this May. The State Championship will be held in Little Rock on Saturday, March 30, 2019. Approximately 100 local attorneys and judges volunteer to help with the coordination and judging of the competition.

Only six students and a teacher-sponsor are needed for a team.
